

Veterinary Care for Your New Kitten

Kittens require vaccines every 4 weeks, up to the age of four months. At about 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ months they should be neutered or spayed.

- **Distemper Vaccinations** should be given every four weeks, for a series of three to four shots. To be effective, it's essential that the shots be given on schedule.
- **<u>Rabies Vaccinations</u>** are required by MA law, even for indoor cats. Your kitten should receive a rabies vaccination when it is about four months old, and annual boosters thereafter.
- <u>Stool Sample</u> We strongly advise that you take your kitten's stool sample to your vet and have it tested for worms.
- **Spay/Neuter Surgery** The age for spay/neuter surgery is at five months for males and at six months for females. For information on low cost spay/neuter surgery, see the Mansfield Shelter website at <u>www.mansfieldshelter.org</u>.
